FREDERICKSBURG/SPOTSYLVANIA/STAFFORD TRIAD BY-LAWS

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the TRIAD shall be to reduce the fear of crime and the criminal victimization of our older citizens, thereby improving the quality of their lives. TRIAD will involve the communities by implementing solutions to the seniors' needs, strengthening communication between law enforcement and senior communities, and educating seniors on local and state resources available in their community.

ARTICLE I NAME AND LOCATION

The name of the organization shall be the Fredericksburg/Spotsylvania/Stafford TRIAD (TRIAD), The principal meeting place shall be at the Rappahannock Area Agency on Aging (RAAA), although a meeting may be held at any location within the Commonwealth of Virginia, at the discretion of the Chairperson. See Article VII for additional meeting information.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The primary purpose of TRIAD is to reduce the fear of crime and the criminal victimization of our older citizens primarily through crime prevention and victim assistance.

Crime Prevention activities will include;

- Accumulating information about reported crimes against senior citizens
- Developing and maintaining a website to provide relevant information to senior citizens
- Implementing programs and activities centering on improving the safety and security of the senior population and the prevention of victimization

Victim Assistance activities will include providing information and support by;

- Developing strategies to assist senior citizens in reporting crime
- Assisting victims in obtaining counseling and access to other service providers for victims
- Serving as a mentor and guide to senior citizens through criminal justice proceedings, including accompanying victims to court hearings

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

TRIAD shall consist of persons who have demonstrated an interest and commitment to seniors in the community.

Members may include designated representatives of each of the TRIAD organizations: Virginia Attorney General and Virginia State Police. Members shall include designated representatives of each of the following organizations: Spotsylvania County Sheriff's Office, Stafford County Sheriff's Office, Fredericksburg City Police Department, AARP and RAAA.

To be considered a member in good standing a TRIAD Member must attend at least 50% of all Council meetings throughout the fiscal year. Only members in good standing are eligible to vote.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS, ELECTIONS & VACANCIES

The elected officers of the TRIAD shall be a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. The officers shall be elected from within the membership for a two (2) year period.

A three (3) member nominating committee shall be appointed at the April meeting prior to an officer's term ending and shall present a slate of candidates for the office at the May meeting, with the election at the June meeting. The term of office shall begin at the start of the fiscal year, July 1. Officers may be re-elected to the same office.

If an elected officer's position becomes vacant, the Chairperson shall appoint a member until the next election.

It is expected that TRIAD officers will attend the monthly meetings. Those unable to attend will notify the Secretary prior to the meeting time in order to continue participation on the Council.

Any officer wishing to resign from the TRIAD shall submit his/her resignation in writing to the Chairperson.

An elected officer may be removed by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote at a regular meeting of eligible members in attendance.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS & MEMBERS

Duties of Officers

- The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the TRIAD, shall appoint committee chairpersons as needed and shall serve as an ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee. The Chairperson shall determine the meeting agenda in conjunction with the other officers. The Chairperson shall preside over the enforcement and observance of the by-laws, supervise the duties of other officers, decide questions of order at a meeting, sit as judge and declare results of all elections, sign checks on the treasury and sign all other legal documents.
- The Vice-Chairperson shall preside in the absence of the Chairperson and shall assume such other duties as may be requested. The Vice-Chairperson may also sign checks on the treasury.
- The **Secretary** shall maintain a membership list, ensure the minutes of each meeting are kept and send timely notifications of all meetings to each member and record attendance.
- The Treasurer shall ensure that accurate records are kept of all monies and financial transactions under the jurisdiction of the TRIAD. The Treasurer shall provide a written Treasurer's Report at each meeting, to be included with the meeting's minutes. The Treasurer shall maintain a checking account in a regular business bank or trust company, signs checks on the treasury and prepares and submits reports, as may be required, to the IRS.

Duties of Members

• Each member shall be familiar with the purpose and mission of the TRIAD, should attend all regular and special meetings of the TRIAD and should serve on at least one committee or event.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

The permanent committees of the TRIAD are:

- Membership
- Nominating (see Article IV above)
- Audit

The Advisory Committees appointed by the Chairperson to carry out special needs may include:

- Training
- Victim Assistance
- Crime Prevention
- Resource Coordination

ARTICLE VII MEETINGS

The annual meeting of this organization shall be held on the first Wednesday of June. The TRIAD shall meet on the first Wednesday of the month. Members will be advised in advance of meeting location. At least two (2) meetings each year should be held at a location providing services primarily to seniors.

A quorum shall consist of at least one (1) officer and five (5) members. At least one representative of the Spotsylvania or Stafford County Sheriff or Fredericksburg Police Department shall be present at all TRIAD meetings to insure a quorum.

Robert's Rules of Order will prevail at any meeting upon the occasion of any conflict not covered by the by-laws.

ARTICLE VIII VOTING

Voting by eligible members shall be conducted as follows. All motions shall be made by voice. If a second is made a discussion will follow. The presiding Chair may close discussion after a reasonable amount of time or a member may "Call for the Question." A vote shall immediately follow. The person making the motion may amend the motion after discussion and it must be seconded. Two minutes shall be sufficient time to receive a second and the presiding Chair shall close the motion as "failed" if no second is made within the time limit. Only one motion can be made at a time. In order to make a new motion, the previous motion must either not receive a second or be voted on with a result. All voting shall be done by voice, tallied by the presiding Chair and recorded. The three options to voting are "yes", "no" and "abstain." A vote carrier is the majority of those voting "yes." A vote fails if less than a majority vote "yes" or a majority vote "no" or the vote ends in tie. Those voting may only vote once during a call for vote.

Voting by members for election of officers shall be by paper ballot.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS

These by-laws may be amended under the following conditions:

- Written notice from any member to the Chairperson must be received ten (10) days prior to a scheduled meeting.
- The proposed amendment will be read and a written copy of the same will be provided to the membership at the end of the regular meeting.
- The proposed amendment will be read and open discussion will be held at the next regular meeting.
- A two-thirds (2/3) majority of those eligible voting members in attendance at the regular meeting is required to adopt the proposed amendment.



What Is TRIAD?

TRIAD is a partnership consisting of the local sheriff and police chief, seniors, and senior service providers in a community who agree to work together to reduce criminal victimization of the elderly. Important to a TRIAD is an advisory council of law enforcement leaders and older persons, which serves as a sounding board, information channel, and catalyst for focusing on reducing crimes against the elderly.

Why Is TRIAD Necessary?

Older Americans make up the fastest growing segment of the population. By 2025, twenty-five percent of Virginia's population will be age 60 or older. This statistic will continue to rise. Criminals prey on older Americans and TRIAD works to prevent exploitation and victimization in this segment of the population.

How Does TRIAD Work?

- TRIAD is run by a S.A.L.T. Council:
 "Seniors And Law Enforcement Together"
- The S.A.L.T. Council develops, expands, and implements effective crime prevention and education programs for seniors. The Council also works to improve the overall quality of life for seniors in the community.

CHOOSING A LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY

Choosing a long-term care facility for yourself or a family member can be difficult, so it is important to allow yourself plenty of time, as your circumstance permits, to find a facility that best suits your needs. Selecting the appropriate placement and making an informed decision are very important. It is recommended that visits be made to several facilities with questions in mind so that the best choices can be made.

Below are some suggestions you may want to consider when making this important decision:

• Geography:

Is the facility located conveniently for visitors and preferred hospitals?

• Financial Status:

Is the facility receptive to accepting the financial status of the prospective resident?

• Level of Care:

Is the facility able to provide the appropriate level of care for the prospective resident?

Quality of Care:

Focus attention on the residents' appearance; are they clean, neat and free of odor?

• Staff to Resident Ratio:

How many direct care staff do they schedule per resident, for each shift? Do they enlist the assistance of outside agencies for staffing needs?

• Resident Attitude:

Do the majority of the residents appear comfortable, pleasant and trusting?

• Activities:

Are group programs provided and well attended, at least twice per day? Is a monthly calendar of activities posted and does it have variety to address individual interests and preferences? Are there special events each month to include family participation? Is there an extra charge for activities or for being transported to outside activities? Is the facility vehicle equipped for wheelchair access?

• Therapy:

Is therapy available to the residents (physical, occupational and/or recreational)?

Housekeeping:

Are housekeepers present and continuously keeping the facility neat and clean?

• Dietary:

Does the monthly menu show adequate variety? Request to have a meal at the facility (usually there is a fee).

• Appearance and General Atmosphere:

Is the facility inviting and comfortably furnished with a home-like warmth?

• Contact the Long-Term Care Ombudsman:

To check whether a facility is operating in compliance with the state and federal guidelines.

VIRGINIA OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM

What is a Long-Term Care Ombudsman?

An **ombudsman** is an advocate for residents' rights and is responsible for investigating complaints made by or on behalf of residents in Nursing Homes and Adult Care Residences. **Ombudsmen** work with residents, family members, concerned citizens, and facilities, as well as public and private agencies, to enhance the quality of care and quality of life for residents in long-term care facilities.

The Virginia Long-Term Care **Ombudsman** Program, as established by the Older American's Act, consists of individuals at the state and local levels. The State Long-Term Care **Ombudsman** is located within the Virginia Association of Area Agencies on Aging in Richmond. Local Long-Term Care **Ombudsmen** are in each Area Agency on Aging, located in lead regional organizations.

Who may need an Ombudsman?

- Residents of Nursing Homes, Adult Care Residences, Assisted Livings and those persons receiving in-home health care services.
- Family and friends of the above.
- Long-Term Care facility staff.
- Government agencies and community groups.
- Anyone seeking information and education regarding long-term care or placement issues.

What to do before contacting the Ombudsman regarding placement issues?

- **Know your preferences.** Narrow your selection to 3-5 facilities and visit each one prior to contacting the **Ombudsman.**
- **Be prepared.** Be organized and have your concerns written down to help you be more effective and ask the right questions.

There is a law in Virginia.....

Virginia Consumer Protection Act Virginia Code Section 59.1-196 et seq.

Purpose of the Law

- * The purpose of Virginia's Consumer Protection Act is to promote fair and ethical standards of dealings between businesses and consumers.
- * The law applies only to the sale or lease of goods or services used primarily for personal, family or household purposes.
- * Misrepresentation, deceit and fraudulent acts or practices by businesses are prohibited.

Prohibited Practices

- * Misrepresenting goods or services as those of another.
- * Misrepresenting the source, sponsorship, approval or certification of goods or services.
- * Misrepresenting the affiliation, connection or association of the supplier, or of the goods or or services, with another.
- * Misrepresenting the geographic origin of goods or services.
- * Misrepresenting the quantities, characteristics, or uses of goods or services.
- * Misrepresenting that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality, grade, style or model.
- * Advertising or offering for sale goods which are used, secondhand, or otherwise defective without so labeling them.
- * Advertising goods or services without the intent to sell them as advertised or without the intent to sell at the advertised price.
- * Making false or misleading statements concerning amounts of, or reasons for, price reductions or false or misleading price comparisons with the supplier's competitors.
- * Misrepresenting that repairs, services, or alterations have been performed or parts installed.
- * Misrepresentation by use of written materials which appear to be an invoice or bill for merchandise or services previously ordered.
- * Using the words "wholesale," "factory," or "manufacturer" for the supplier's name unless

the supplier is primarily engaged in such a business.

- * Using a liquidated damage clause, penalty clause, waiver of defense, or attempting to collect liquidated damages, when such clause is void or unenforceable under Virginia or Federal law or regulations.
- * Using any other deception, fraud, false pretense or promise in connection with consumer transactions. Committing violations pertaining to the sale of certain animals by pet dealers as described in Section 3.1-796.78, 3.1-796.79 or 3.1-796.82 of the Code of Virginia.
- * Failing to disclose all conditions, charges, or fees relating to layaways and to return of goods for refund, exchange, or credit.
- * Also, failing to provide written notice of an existing open-end credit balance in excess of \$5 on an account maintained by the supplier and resulting from the consumer's overpayment on such account.

Further Violations

* Any violation of the following acts: the Virginia Health Spa Act; the Virginia Home Solicitation Sales Act; the automobile Repair Facilities Act; the Virginia Lease-Purchase Agreement Act; the Virginia Public Telephone Information Act; the Credit Services Businesses Act; the Prizes Act and Gifts Act; the Collision Damage Waiver Act; Section 54-1-1505 of the Code of Virginia relating to hearing aids; the Refund Policy; the Motor Vehicle Manufactures' Warranty Adjustment Act; the Pay-Per-Call Services Act; the Extended Service Contract Act; the Virginia Membership Camping Act; the Comparison Price Advertising Act; the Virginia Travel Club Act; and Sections 46.2-1231 and 46.2-12331 of the Code of Virginia, relating to towing.

ISSUES TO CONSIDER WHEN MOVING A LOVED ONE TO THE FREDERICKSBURG VIRGINIA AREA

There comes a time when the difficult conversation of moving our parents and loved ones to be closer to us must start. This decision may be due to a want to have our parents closer to our families, to have the ability to more closely monitor Mom and Dad's everyday living skills, or the need to provide adequate care for our elderly loved ones. One out of every four people is a caregiver for a family member or friend. In the absence of a spouse who is able to provide care, a daughter or daughter in law is most likely to assume the role of caregiver. Whatever the instance, there are numerous factors to be discussed in making this decision. Moves can be traumatic for anyone.

This list of issues is by no means all-inclusive. Every situation will be different and therefore; must be looked at on a personal level. Take into consideration all the current services a person is receiving or could be receiving if needed. Comparing costs is an important thing to do, but should not be the only factor that effects the decision. Emotional well-being is an important aspect of keeping us healthy.
